Saskatchewan Distance Learning Centre (Sask DLC) is dedicated to providing high-quality Kindergarten to Grade 12 (K-12) online learning opportunities for students throughout Saskatchewan. We are dedicated to continuous improvement and growth, leadership at all levels, academic excellence, and a strong, cohesive culture. This is accomplished through providing learning opportunities that are responsive to students, families and communities while meeting the needs of our growing and diverse province.

Student Support Teachers - High School

Saskatchewan Distance Learning Centre requires three continuing (permanent) Student Support Teachers. The positions include two full-time (1.0 FTE) and one half-time (0.5 FTE) to be assigned at one of our regional campus locations across the province based on the principal residence of the successful candidates. These positions are not remote or virtual work from home.

Sask DLC is a newly formed Treasury Board Crown Corporation in Saskatchewan, created to deliver high-quality and equitable online learning programs to students across the province. Sask DLC's head office is located in Kenaston, with an administrative office in Regina, and nine regional campuses located in Swift Current, Moose Jaw, Estevan, Yorkton, Saskatoon, Nipawin, Prince Albert, Neilburg and La Ronge. Sask DLC delivers online programming to full-time K-12 students and part-time students attending schools across the province.

These teaching assignments will include Student Support Services and other subjects scheduled in consultation with the school-based administrator, consultant, or Assistant Superintendent with student services responsibilities. The Student Support Teacher provides learning assistance to students with diverse needs, accommodates with differentiation of instruction to meet the needs of all learners, and collaborates with classroom teachers and parents in supporting the needs within the school.

Experience in student support, diverse learning needs, online teaching or online supervision for differentiated programming would be considered an asset.

At Sask DLC, we are committed to providing students with a quality online educational experience; an integral part of that being meaningful student and parent interactions. As an online instructor, you will work with students in an online environment and will in most cases, be the primary point of contact for our learners. We are seeking to recruit a teacher who seeks to understand the challenges of online learning and strives to create real connections with our students, bridging the distance between them.

Our ideal candidate will be able to demonstrate:

- student-centred decision making; knowledge of curriculum, current research-based instructional and assessment strategies;
- knowledge and understanding of diverse student learning styles and associated needs;

- innovation and creativity to support students achieving learning outcomes in a variety of approaches that fit student needs and interest;
- effective communication with parents on student educational needs and progress;
- effective and efficient time management and organizational abilities;
- flexibility with the capacity to problem solve; motivation to be an adult learner;
- strengths in collegiality and collaboration; commitment to work collaboratively with all staff to carry out the mission and vision of Sask DLC;
- communicate clear and effective feedback on student progress; and
- experience with technologies such as Clevr, Moodle, MySchoolSask, and online communication software would be considered an asset.

Skills Required:

- demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with additional student support personnel and professionals to address student needs;
- knowledge of community and provincial supports that assist youth with disabilities and the transition to adulthood; and
- experience supporting individuals aged 15-22 and providing support for mental health.
